On November 20, 2012, the Court appointed Michael K. Rozen, Esq. as Director of Medical Monitoring (the "Director") in the above-referenced matter to oversee the implementation of the Medical Panel Protocols for the Medical Monitoring Program (the "Program"). The Director has previously submitted 20 Status Reports to the Court summarizing the progress and status of planning for implementation of the Medical Panel Protocols, most recently on September 21, 2015.

The Program was launched with a mailing of notice packets to approximately 98,000 potential Class Members in the beginning of September 2014 and Class Members have been registering, making appointments for monitoring and receiving monitoring pursuant to the Medical Panel Protocols. Since September 2014, additional notice packets have been mailed to potential Class Members upon request bringing the total number of mailings to 99,013.

Each week the Director submits to the parties a Weekly Summary Report with detailed Program Statistics. Attached hereto is the Weekly Summary Report for the week ending October 2, 2015, which sets out in detail the current number of Program participants (6,561 Registrations to date) and their demographics, as well as, among other information, the number of scheduled physician monitoring appointments, the number of approved services, and the total amount approved for payment. Also attached is a CPT Code Summary Report setting forth the total services approved for payment by the Director through September 29, 2015, by CPT Code.

By agreement of the parties, the Director mails an Affidavit of Settlement Class Membership to all Registrants with insufficient documentation, along with a letter which explains that a completed and notarized Affidavit will be accepted as proof of Class Member status and eligibility to participate fully in the C-8 Medical Monitoring Program. As of October 2, 2015 a total of 5,818 Registrants have been deemed eligible for medical monitoring.

The parties continue to work with the Director, his team, and each other in good faith.
